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Learning objectives:

Students whose level of English is below B1 (according to electronic entry test) attend the two preparatory modules EPRE1 and EPRE2, parallel to their EFE1 and EFE2 modules, in order to improve their English to a level that allows them to pass the module exams.

Students can make simple (oral and written) statements on well-known topics in everyday situations.

Students get to know certain aspects of Anglo-Saxon culture.

Course content:

- practising the four skills (speaking, writing, reading, listening) with a special focus on the English-speaking cultures.
- repetition of basic grammar and vocabulary
- Speaking: talking about everyday problems, simple short presentations etc.
- Writing: short descriptions, notes, letters etc.
- Reading: notes, simple articles, simplified literature etc.
- Listening: simple conversations, instructions in standard language
